We generally remember the urban planning ambitions of Leopold II and the grand boulevards laid out by Victor Besme, his master builder. We forget that the King wanted a green city where nature would have its rightful place. At the heart of the new districts that are about to spring up, large estates will be preserved to create magnificent public parks, the green jewels of the inner suburbs. We take you on a tour of the two parks created to open up the borders of Saint-Gilles and Forest: Parc Duden and Parc de Forest. In the same way that the major avenues will create beautiful views in the city, the parks will offer great ventilation, open views over the city, intimate spaces for lovers, great playgrounds for families, but also an inexhaustible palette of colours.

In the heart of the Forêt de Soignes, there is a place steeped in history where, since the dawn of time, people have come to honour the forest, to live out their spirituality, to exploit it and to find resources not only for their survival, but also for their health. Rendez-vous with sleepy Mother Nature

What better place to admire autumn than in the Pede valley, arguably the most Bruegelian of all, and the setting for several of the painter's masterpieces, including the Peasant Wedding and the Parable of the Blind. Cut by the Ring, the valley passes through all the strata between town and country without leaving the Region, and above all, it offers a magnificent sample of the indigenous flora (black alder, ash, lime, reeds, etc.), offering, at this time of year, an extraordinary palette of golds, carmines, burgundies, oranges and ochres. The beauty and serenity of the area have even won over the wildlife, including the migratory birds that have been flocking to the banks of the many ponds along the river for several years now.

Rendez-vous with Mother Nature: the Silence

More than the Forest, the park must prepare for winter, because 'domesticated' nature is more fragile, more precious and often exotic. We invite you to take a stroll through one of the Region's richest and most romantic parks: Josaphat in Schaerbeek, where the name alone is enough of a winter's tale. We'll see how the municipality has laid out a whole trail of memory and promoted local folklore through remarkable statuary, most of it created by local artists; how it has created places that have become emblematic of the moments of relaxation of the Schaerbeekers who use it throughout the year, as well as a veritable arboretum, at this time of year, dormant and protected from the attacks of the frost, but which remains resplendent.



Cultural anchorage: The Water

From the Place Fontainas to the Grand-Place, via rue Marché aux Poissons, we'll be exploring some little-known aspects of the Senne. We'll follow its winding course, discovering the maritime district with its quays and centuries-old customs buildings, not forgetting the new constructions that recall the old port facilities. Using illustrations from the period and the few traces it has left in today's city, we will bring it back to life. Through the winding streets, the curves of the squares, the "holes in the Senne" and the sites of the old ramparts that lined it, we'll be able to feel the river flowing beneath our feet.

Cultural anchorage: The Earth

Itinéraires invites you to discover the landscape that our ancestors shaped to become the capital of Europe. After wanting to turn it into a new Rome built on seven hills, in the 19th century they did everything they could to make it resemble Paris, with its boulevards and the legend of its birth on an island in the river Senne around a royal residence...Today, we know that the city was born sheltered from the whims of its river, on Mont Saint-Michel, where a small chapel became a cathedral. All around lay the fields of the first inhabitants of Brussels, the first workshops in the steep streets, often interrupted by staircases leading down to the Grand-Place, and later by magnificent palaces. The city was built on the steep right bank of the Senne, while the other bank was for a long time its food reserve and became Molenbeek.

Cultural anchorage: The Fire

Itinéraires invites you to take a cultural journey: Fire and the Sun. Strong elements in the life of cities, of great fascination for some and great fear for others... These opposing feelings have left contrasting traces in the architecture, in the urban planning choices, in the iconography of the palaces and churches, but also in the bourgeois houses and even in the Houses of the Gildes on the Grand-Place. We invite you to take a stroll through some of the best-known districts, where you'll discover an infinite number of details and symbolic messages flooded with light, warmth... or fear of the terrible plague.

Cultural anchorage: The air

Itinéraires invites you to take a stroll through the world of wind power. Wind power is the easiest form of energy to install in towns and cities, and Brussels seems very reluctant to use it. There is, however, one municipality where wind power has found a home: Woluwe-Saint-Lambert. Around its pioneering windmill, a whole series of projects are trying to use the power of the wind, as well as other techniques, to reduce their carbon footprint. Creative workshops, large companies, commercial spaces, even the names of certain streets – air has the wind in its sails here...
